## **MOTHER'S EMPTY CHAIR**

A woman's daughter had asked the local minister to come and pray with her mother. When the minister arrived, he found the woman lying in bed with her head propped up on two pillows. An empty chair sat beside her bed.

The minister assumed that the woman had been informed of his visit. "I guess your were expecting me", he said.

"No, who are you?" said the mother.

The minister told her his name and then remarked, "I saw the empty chair and I figured you knew I was going to show up."

"Oh yeah, the chair," said the bedridden woman. "Would you mind closing the door?" Puzzled, the minister shut the door.

"I have never told anyone this, not even my daughter," said the woman.

"But all of my life I have never known how to pray. At church I used to hear the pastor talk about prayer, but it went right over my head." I abandoned any attempt at prayer, "the woman continued, "until one day four years ago; by best friend said to me, "Betty, prayer is just a simple matter of having a conversation with Jesus. Here is what I suggest. Sit down in a chair; place an empty chair in front of you and, in faith, see Jesus on the chair. It's not spooky because he promised, "I will be with you always."

"Then just speak to him in the same way your doing with me right now."

"So, I tried it and I like it so much that I do it a couple of hours every day.

I'm careful though. If my daughter saw me talking to an empty chair, she'd either had a nervous breakdown or send me off to the funny farm."

The minister was deeply moved by the story and encouraged the woman to continue on the journey.

Then he prayed with her, anointed her with oil, and returned to the church.

Two nights later the daughter called to tell the minister that her mother had died that afternoon.

"Did she die in peace?" he asked.

"Yes, when I left the house about two o'clock,

she called me over to her bedside,

told me she loved me and kissed me on the cheek.

When I got back from the store an hour later, I found her.

But there was something strange about her death.

Apparently, just before Mother died,

she leaned over and rested her head

on the chair beside the bed.

What do you make of that?"

The minister wiped a tear from his eye and said,

"I wish we could all go like that."



## “Unity in the Body of Christ”

Saint Paul, the great Apostle to the Gentiles, found it necessary to remind the Corinthians of the importance of Christian unity. Charismatic gifts were not uncommon in the early Church, but some of these gifts, e.g., speaking in tongues, were looking upon by some as being superior to other gifts/talents which the Holy Spirit freely bestows upon whom He wills. In his first Epistle to the Corinthians, Paul used the beautiful analogy of the human body and its parts, comparing it to the Church of Christ and her members.

*“As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ.”* (I Corinthians 12:12)

It’s a common tactic by the devil to cause dissension wherever and whenever he and his fallen angels may. One need only turn on the TV news or flip through a newspaper and find many examples of division in our nation, in our world.

Why does it seem our world prefers division to unity? Certainly our personal egos, opinions and unbridled emotions play a part. Another cause may be that listening is becoming a lost art. When we refuse to truly listen, there can be no dialogue because we are only interested in our viewpoint. Modern politics is infested with this.

Within our family, school, work, and church communities, there will always be differences of opinion. This is often good and healthy. We can learn new things and other points of view, provided we are open to dialogue, emotions in check. Emotions are neither necessarily good nor bad. We experience them, up and down, hot and cold, in any given day. But when we allow them to take charge, we lose all sense of calm and reason. Confusion, bitterness, and anger usually follow. This is what affected the Corinthians when they believed one gift/opinion/attitude superior to others. From that scenario, disunity emerges and the devil succeeds. He exults in causing discord between husband and wife, parent and child, classmates, co-workers and parishioners.

The Springfield Diocese’s Pastoral Planning was one way of addressing the declining number of both Catholics and priests in the four counties of Western Mass. The way the plan was implemented is a cause for a variety of opinions, and likely will be debated for years. In the resultant merging of many parishes and the closures of others, there can be a desire to assign blame: *“The pastor doesn’t understand; he’s stubborn.”/“The bishop is an uncaring, bad man.”/“That person only cares about him/herself.”/ etc.*

Although there is a real sense of loss, confusion, and open wounds that will take time to heal in these transitions, can we not hear Saint Paul calling us to unity? ***“There may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy.”*** (I Corinthians 12:25-26)

Discord and disunity are never from God. As the **Most Blessed Trinity** exists in perfect harmony and unity, we, the members of the Church, **the Body of Christ**, are called to that unity. *We’re human; we’re imperfect; it’s not easy!* But so much more is gained, in ways that we can’t yet foresee, *when all the members try to work in harmony.*
