“The Richness of Our Worship.”

In a short time, the English-speaking world will welcome the revised Roman Missal. This is the third typical edition (the original Latin was approved by **Pope John Paul II** on Holy Thursday, 2000 and published in 2002). Here follows a timeline.

The order of celebrating the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass was revised after the Second Vatican Council. **Pope Paul VI** promulgated the revised **Roman Missal (*Missale Romanum*)** in 1969. What had formerly been one volume, became the Roman Missal in two volumes: the **Sacramentary** containing the prayers proper to Mass and the **Lectionary** containing the Scripture readings for Mass. This was due in large part to the increased number of readings over a three year Sunday and two year weekday cycle.

In the United States, the Order of Mass of Paul VI was approved for use in 1970, and the liturgical books were confirmed by the Holy See and published in 1973. The Latin edition of the *Missale Romanum* was reissued in 1975. A second edition of the U.S. Sacramentary containing minor changes and updates (including new saints/blesseds to the liturgical calendar) was issued in 1985. After years of preparation, primarily to provide a more accurate and dignified translation from Latin, the third English edition of the Roman Missal was approved by the Holy See in 2009.

What remains now is for the final preparation and printing of the liturgical books. It is anticipated that the revised **Sacramentary** of the *Roman Missal* will be in parishes in late 2011, perhaps around the start of the Advent Season. This allows sufficient time for the introduction of the new translations to the average person in the pew.

As stated on the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB): ***“May this process of the implementation of the revised Roman Missal be a time of deepening, nurturing, and celebrating our faith through our worship and the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy.”***

There are some voices of dissent with varying objections. Some say the new language is too lofty, or not common enough (would ordinary street language or slang be worthy of our worship of God?). Others argue that it’s unnecessary or too soon to change. We will only confuse people in the pews (where was that argument when the **Missal of St. Pius V** was literally discarded----*never a request from the faithful*----and replaced with the **Missal of Paul VI** with very little, or rather no preparation?).

In response to this we turn to Bishop Arthur Serratelli, Chairman of the USCCB Committee on Divine Worship. He readily admits that some will not like the new translations, but anyone with an open mind and heart should recognize the beautiful gift we are about to receive. Bishop Serratelli reminds us that the preparation of this third edition of the Missal took place over five years, certainly not a hasty or reckless process. The translations are understandable, dignified and accurate. So many are working so enthusiastically on the new texts in order to deepen our understanding of the Church’s worship. Whereas the current texts were loosely translated or paraphrased, the bishop says that the revised translations preserve both the biblical and theological richness of the original Latin texts. This will be a time to appreciate anew the beauty of the Mass.

BE PROUD THAT YOU ARE CATHOLIC

This is an interesting observation by a non-Catholic. It doesn't undo the harm the Church has caused by being slow to recognize and react to abusive priests, but it does cast an interesting light on what the media continues to portray as a "Catholic" problem. The following are excerpts of a speech given by non-Catholic Sam Miller – a prominent Cleveland Jewish businessman:

"Why would newspapers carry on a vendetta on one of the most important institutions that we have today in the United States, namely the Catholic Church?"

Do you know – the Catholic Church educates 2.6 million students every day at the cost to that Church of 10 billion dollars, and a savings on the other hand to the American taxpayer of 18 billion dollars. The graduates go on to graduate studies at the rate of 92%

The Church has 230 colleges and universities in the U.S. with an enrollment of 700,000 students.

The Catholic Church has a non-profit hospital system of 637 hospitals, which account for hospital treatment of 1 out of every 5 people – not just Catholics – in the United States today.

But the press is vindictive and trying to totally denigrate in every way the Catholic Church in this country. They have blamed the disease of pedophilia on the Catholic Church, which is as irresponsible as blaming adultery on the institution of marriage.

Let me give you some figures that Catholics should know and remember. For example, 12% of the 300 Protestants clergy surveyed admitted to sexual intercourse with a parishioner; 38% acknowledge other inappropriate sexual contact in a study by the United Methodist Church, 41.8% of clergy women reported unwanted sexual behavior; 17% of laywomen have been sexually harassed.

Meanwhile, 1.7% of the Catholic clergy has been found guilty of pedophilia. 10% of the Protestant ministers have been found guilty of pedophilia. This is not a Catholic problem.

A study of American priests showed that most are happy in the priesthood and find it even better than they had expected, and that most, if given the choice, would choose to be priest again in face of all the obnoxious PR the church has been receiving.

The Catholic Church is bleeding from self-inflicted wounds. The agony that Catholics have felt and suffered is not necessarily the fault of the Church. You have been hurt by a small number of wayward priests that have probably and hopefully been totally weeded out by now.

Walk with your shoulders high and your head higher. Be a proud member of the most important non-governmental agency in the United States. Then remember what the prophet Jeremiah said '*Stand by the roads, and look and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is and walk in it, and find rest for your souls*'. Be proud to speak up for your faith with pride and reverence and learn what your Church does for all other religions.

Be proud that you're a Catholic."
